Time with Tom

Love letters from God. God sends us love letters via people. God has been sending us love letters since the Genesis in creation. God loves us so much he created a garden for us to live in and wants us to love him back. Even when we turned from him he continued to love us and send us love notes. He sent us love notes by telling the prophets how we need to live and how we should love each other. He sent love notes when he gave us the poems of David we call Psalms. He gave us love notes we call the Ten Commandments. These are ten words of love we were told by Luther to study everyday.

I would like you to find a way to remind yourselves of these love notes from God by putting them in front of you everyday. Find a place you go everyday; the fridge, the mirror, your car or truck. Some location you can hang them so you cannot miss them and then read them everyday until you know them and their meanings according to Luther's' small catechism. Luther said (I paraphrase) anyone who knows the Ten Commandments knows the entire Bible. And if we know the Ten Commandments as words of love from God why wouldn't we want to know them by heart? The three tables we use to divide the ten words help us to know what God is saying about loving him and our neighbor.

The first table says he is our God and the only God we need because he frees us to be the people he created. He tells us when we love manmade gods we become slaves to them and are not free to live in Christ or have life eternal but we struggle our whole life serving the idols of man. When we remember to keep a day of rest we have time to love our God and show his love to our children our neighbors and our livestock by giving them rest as well.

The other two tables teach us how to love our neighbor as ourselves and so our neighbor can love us also. When God tells us not to kill or steal or commit adultery he is telling us to defend and protect our neighbor and all that is our neighbors including his wife and our marriage bed. Do not covet anything sums up most of the remainders. God wants us to not long for the things we don't have but long for a relationship with God so he can give us all the things we truly need for a good life and for our neighbor to have a good life.

Matthew 22nd says we should love the Lord our God with all our heart and soul and mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. The second is like the first; we should love our neighbor as ourselves. All the laws and prophet hang on these two commandments. The Ten (Words) Commandments are love notes from God so we can live in a loving relationship with God and all he created and continues to create. Love God, and love your neighbor. What commandments will you remember? *Amen*,




MST 2020 will be in need of pies for:

Mission

Dear friends,

I have just returned from a visit to Mozambique where I met with Bishop Sinalo and colleagues at the head office of the Evangelical Lutheran in Mozambique (IELM) in the capital city of Maputo.

I was also in Chimoio in west-central Mozambique and travelled with the Dean of the Central District and local pastors to visit the Martin Luther Clinic at Munene.

The clinic and ambulance (with ELCA Global Mission support) continue to provide vital health care services for rural communities in the area.

The mud-brick church at Munene was destroyed by Cyclone Desmond in late 2018. Members of the congregation have been molding bricks and are busy re-building the church.

In Chimoio I also met up with the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) emergency response team. The LWF team is part of the ACT Alliance appeal (SAF191) assisting communities in Mozambique, Malawi and Zimbabwe affected by Cyclone Idai which caused hundreds of deaths and displaced thousands of households in mid-April. For the next 6 - 24 months the LWF team, in collaboration with the Evangelical Lutheran

Church in Mozambique and other ecumenical and government agencies, will be focusing on providing emergency food, shelter and WASH (Water, Sanitation and

Hygiene) assistance.

Bishop Sinalo expressed appreciation for the continuing companionship, prayers and support from the ELCA, LWF and partners of the IELM.

Thank you for your participation in God's mission locally and globally.


