APRIL 2021 Time with Tom

What have we learned from our Lenten journey? Did the teachings of Jesus call us to a new vision as Lutherans? Was Jesus clear about the discipleship of the called children of God? These are good questions for us to ponder now that we are moving into the time of year when we go out into the world traveling on vacations or going to the lake. These are times when we will be away from our regular church influence being Jesus' disciples carrying the good news of Jesus Christ along with our travel bags. For some of us we will be staying close to home, as we understand our roll during this pandemic. Worship on Sunday mornings may look different from years past, hopefully better than last year's summer worship options. I remember reading the Lutheran magazine and coming across a story about being a welcoming church.

The story asked a good question about what it means to be a welcoming church. First the phrase "all are welcome" is a difficult statement on which to follow through. All are welcome sounds nice but is it true? We would like to think so but like Wendy Healy explains in her article; all is more than just the family, friends and people with like interests that we normally will see on a Sunday morning. We may want "All" to be 'all people like us' are welcome! Maybe all are not welcome or at least not yet? If we have learned anything from Jesus during lent, we should have noticed Jesus spent more time around people that were not like Jesus and were opposing Jesus. Jesus welcomed them even when they were not welcoming Jesus.

If we are a welcoming church do we have to find a way to set out the welcome mat for every person on earth or just the people who are likely to visit our church? If we want to become a welcoming church this summer season we will need to first decide whom we are and what we have to welcome them into. If we have a clean building, a welcoming web site and a nice sign out front that helps passersby feel comfortable enough to enter our building. We have then just begun to be a welcoming church.

The next thing according to the Lutheran Mag article is being friendly but not over the top so we chase away the ones who are not comfortable with the touchy feely welcome, (not a problem in a pandemic but maybe that will change soon). Yes these things are important but what I found most important would be for us to first know who we are and what is our niche, Bob Fritch also added to the story with the reminder; "we are not here to keep the clubhouse open. We're called to bring God's word, and we must do it in new and different ways" Fritch said.

Who are we at First Lutheran, and how do we bring God's word to all the people we welcome to worship. How do we welcome all people? Lets start by remembering who we are and how will we spend our summer being Jesus to all, at home and away, *Amen*.

*Christian Ed / Youth and Family:

This team served soup supper on Wednesday March 10th. The Time Capsule project also took place on March 10th with the 1st and 2nd graders. They are going to discuss at their next team meeting if they will meet in person for the last 4 weeks of WOW. Confirmation students are meeting after Wednesday services to discuss the sermon. First Communion camps are taking place and the First Communion service is scheduled for Sunday April 11th at 10:00 AM.

*Personnel Committee:

This team will be actively working on filling the Christian Education Director position. They are also filling a position for a Media Director. They will also be working to fill the Financial Bookkeeper role as Tonia Beavers has put in her resignation for this position. *Endowment:

Endowment team again voted to donate \$100.00 per camper toward the Green Lake Bible camp.

*Worship and Music:

Good Friday service will be a pre-recorded coop service broadcast online, radio and cable access TV. This team discussed the schedule for Holy Week and leaders for each service. They also discussed what will change with services as pandemic restrictions change. What will become of the cooperative that has been formed? 1. Sola Gratia (Grace alone)

Salvation is the free gift of God to man. It is given by God's Grace alone and not through any merit on the part of the Christian. GRACE = God's Riches At Christ's Expense. "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast." Ephesians 2:8-9.

2. Sola Fide (Faith alone)

We are judged by God purely on the basis of our faith. FAITH = Forsaking All I Trust Him. "But that no man is justified by the law in the sight of God, it is evident: for the just shall live by faith." Galatians 3:11.

3. Solus Christus (Christ alone)


Christ is our communicator to God. Our salvation is accomplished only through Christ's death and resurrection. "For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus;" 1 Timothy 2:5.

4. Sola Scriptura (Scripture alone)

Sola Scriptura does not mean that all truth is contained in the Bible, but rather that all mankind needs to know that salvation is contained within its pages. "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." 2 Timothy 3:16-17.

5. Soli Deo Gloria (To the glory of God alone)

Every aspect of the Christian life is to be giving glory to God. This basically summarizes all the other four Soli.












Dear friends,

It is almost a year since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic and the implimentation of lockdowns and other measures by most countries in the world to curb the spread of the virus.

Globally, as of 10:15am CET, 26 February 2021, there were 112,456,453 confirmed cases of COVID-19, including 2,497,514 deaths, reported to the World Health Organization (WHO). https://covid19.who.int/ South Africa has reported about 1.5 million infections and over 50,000 related deaths.

Several coronavirus vaccines have been developed and approved for use but access, cost and distribution are matters of deep concern. In an open letter to the leaders of the G7 countries The Lutheran World Federation (LWF) General Secretary Rev. Dr Martin Junge noted: "Wealthy countries have secured their doses, sometimes in more quantities than they need, while other countries and their populations have inadequate or no access at all." https://www.lutheranworld.org/news/covid-19-until-all-are-safe-no-one-safe

The ELCA's Lutheran Disaster Response has responded to appeals from companion churches in Southern Africa to support several programs during the first and now second wave of the pandemic. Activities include distributing relevant information about the pandemic, Personal Protective Equipment and food hampers to vulnerable communities. Lockdowns and restrictions on the numbers of people allowed at

funerals and church services have also affected the pastoral, financial and evangelism work of the churches.

However, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Malawi reported that evangelism training workshops were held in 2020 for pastors, evangelists and youth leaders. The report stated, "The evangelism work has been hard especially during this period of Covid-But despite this... trainings and meetings have been going on very well." The report included the story of Mr. Kwayera who attended one of the training workshops. He is an elder and Confirmation teacher in a local congregation. (In the photo Mr. Kwayera is holding up Sunday School and Confirmation resource books translated into Chichewa, the official language in Malawi.)



In a recent email ELCM Bishop Joseph Brumbwe wrote: "Kindly please convey our appreciation to the Global Mission office in Chicago and the ELCA members who always support our efforts for the sake of the mission of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."
