*Pastors report:

Pastor Tom reported:

~MST 2024 planning is moving forward. Four students are signed up at this point. Bryan Larson has taken on the role of treasurer. There is a new team being formed to help with the planning and organizing of the MST program.

~Numerous weddings including pre-marital classes are scheduled at FLC. Many baptisms are also scheduled to take place in the near future.

~The co-op efforts continue and we are always seeking ways to work together as a cooperative. The co-op band has asked for more opportunities to perform together. Carol Dragt is looking into performing at other venues like Meeker Manor and Emmaus Place

~FLC Staff is busy planning the Sunday school and confirmation classes.

~Per the Councils request at a previous meeting, Pastor Tom has been in contact with Pastor Steve Cook regarding the discussion of a Second Pastor at First Lutheran Church. The Executive team asked Pastor Tom to create a job description based around an Associate Pastor role. The Executive team along with Pastor Tom discussed in detail the criteria to be included in the job description.

This has been completed and will be presented to the council.

~A work night took place at the church facilities. The landscaping around the sign on the West side was addressed. Some unwanted shrubbery was removed and weeds were pulled around the perimeter of the church. The lower exit door area was also cleared of leaves and debris.

An Ancient Stewardship Message: Some Christians actively avoid church on Stewardship Sunday because giving is a private matter "between me and God." New pastors are even sometimes advised never to preach about money, lest certain people get riled up. Yet Jesus talks frequently in the Gospels about giving and sharing our material goods - and he wasn't the first in Scripture to do so.

A thousand years before Christ's birth, King David prepared to had over the kingdom to his son, gathering tons (literally!) of gold, silver and other materials for Solomon to use in building the temple. Revealing his take on stewardship, David prayed: "But who am I, and who are my people, that we should be able to give as generously as this? Everything comes from you, and we have given you only what comes from your hand" (1 Chronicles 29:14, NIV).


- ~There was a re-cap of the MST fair stand. The stand operated as planned and appeared to be a very good fund-raising event. Thank you to all who volunteered!

Poet Rainer Maria Rilke said, "I live my life in widening circles that reach out across the world." Indeed, we all do. As newborns, we focus only on ourselves. Warm greetings.

What does a missionary look like? What makes you a missionary? It's not your country of origin, or a plane ticket to a far destination ... but your baptism! It is by God's grace, that whoever and wherever we are, we are called, gathered, equipped and sent to participate in God's Mission of transformation, reconciliation and empowerment.





In the ELCA we have adopted the "accompaniment" model for mission, understood as: "Walking together in solidarity, that practices interdependence and mutuality. In this walk, gifts, resources and experiences are shared with mutual advice and admonition to deepen and expand our work within God's mission."

An important insight here is that the church does not have a mission or missions, but God's mission has a church. It is also important to lift up the five accompaniment values of Mutuality, Inclusivity, Vulnerability, Sustainability and Empowerment.

During the months of July and August I have been visiting sponsoring congregations in the US as part of Home Assignment. These biennial visits were cancelled in 2020 due to COVID. It is a privilege being able to travel again and to share together in worship, conversation and fellowship.

We have been talking about the impact of the pandemic, climate change, conflict, food insecurity, racism and poverty in our communities, and around the world. And we are reflecting on mission accompaniment, what we as individuals, congregations, companion churches and communities can learn and do to participate faithfully in God's mission, locally and globally.






