April 2023 Time with Tom

The days of Easter are full upon us. We have been watching Jesus mission to Jerusalem for the last weeks leading up to the passion. We hear him calling us into the ministry of sharing the Good News of God's grace. Do we know what that means exactly? Sharing the Good News of the creator God's only Son who died for you and me, gives us life. Just the sharing of this story, brings light into a dark world. Jesus tells the disciple what they need to know and they have a difficult time understanding it all. We read from Luke 24, while in the upper room with the disciples, ⁴⁴Jesus said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." ⁴⁵Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, ⁴⁶and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸You are witnesses of these things".

We have heard the story and as baptized members of God's church, we are called to be sent into the world as witnesses of the same good news. It sounds like bad news, Jesus dies; but it is Good News because of God's love for creation, we may live. This happy exchange was devised by God to show grace to those who hear the Word (Jesus is the Word of God) and believe. Our role as Christ followers is to tell the story of Jesus life, death and resurrection to all nations. We are called to love the Lord our God with all our heart and all our soul and all our mind and all our strength. We are also called to love our neighbor as ourselves. Jesus said all the laws and prophets hang on these two commandments.

As we move into these days of the Easter Season, I ask you to carry the words of Jesus with you in all your conversations and activities. Knowing Jesus walks with us as we work and play can be comforting. Understand that God goes before us, the Spirit of God paves a way for us to meet with those who God wants to know the love God has for all people. We bring that Good News knowing Jesus will give us the words to say and the ones receiving this Good News will be ready to receive from us all that God tells us to bring. Trust in the truth of Jesus Christ and live in the light and life of the Word of God who dwells in us. Jesus is the Word and the light and the truth and the life that brings us everlasting life with God the father and all the saints that have gone before us. That is Good News for all people. This is the Easter Season, go and tell the story. Amen

~Meeting was held in conjunction with the Council Retreat.

*Secretary report was approved after a correction to the date for the last day of Sunday school was made.

*Treasurer report was approved.

***Pastor Tom reported:

~MST International / Braga Portugal group will be serving a French Toast breakfast on Easter Sunday from 7:30 to noon.

- ~The Grief support group has added another meeting time to their schedule. They are now meeting twice a month. The support group has been promoted to other churches in the community and the attendance has grown. Thank you to those who have helped to make this mission a success.
- ~The call committee awaits more candidates to be brought forth from the Synod.
- ~Outgoing Council member debriefings have not been completed. Hopefully they can be completed by the next council meeting.
- ~The 8:30 AM radio spot on KLFD may be changing. In the interest of keeping a consistent opportunity for the listeners, Pastor Tom is researching the possibility of the Co-op securing this time slot for broadcasting a weekly service.

***Team Reports:

*Christian Education:

- ~The team will provide a breakfast for the Sunday School kids on Palm Sunday during the Sunday School hour. They will also do a craft project during this time.
- ~The Good Friday service will be partially led by our youth.
- ~The last day of Sunday School will be on April 30th.
- ~It has been decided that the team will not be working with Green Lake Bible Camp for the Vacation Bible School (VBS) program. They will create the VBS program as a team. The dates for VBS will be June 5th, 6th & 7th from 5:30 PM to 7:30 PM. They plan to center the program around the 150th anniversary of First Lutheran Church.

*Church Property:

- ~Tables for Chilstrom Hall will be ordered per previous discussion.
- ~The water softener was again discussed. It was decided that the custodians will monitor the salt level instead of working with Finken Water.
- ~Unused floor maintenance machines stored in the utility room will be removed. They will be donated to another church or someone else in need, or properly disposed of. New machines were purchased a few years ago and the old ones are taking up valuable space.
- ~It has been brought to the team's attention that the roof drains on the flat roof area are possibly not draining properly. This issue will be researched in the spring after the snow is off the roof.
- ~Lighting in the Sanctuary was discussed. It was decided that the lights would be changed individually to LED style fixtures whenever maintenance is required.

~An update from the call committee was briefly discussed.


*Council New Business:

Mission

Dear friends,

Warm greetings from Johannesburg, South Africa.

Earlier this month, pastors and lay delegates of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Mozambique (IELM) gathered in the capital city Maputo for the church's general assembly.

Some of the delegates from the northern part of the country travelled for two days over 2000km on public transportation to attend the meeting.

The theme chosen for the assembly was based on Nehemiah 2: 17-18 which focuses on Nehemiah's call to the returning exiles to work together to rebuild the temple and the broken walls of Jerusalem.



Delegates received reports and reflected on the challenges facing the church in Mozambique including financial sustainability, the effects of COVID-19, climate change, the ongoing insurgency in the north and a struggling economy.

Presiding Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Zimbabwe Bishop K. Sibanda, Rev. L. Kasper (Executive Director of the Lutheran Communion in Southern Africa (LUCSA), the General Secretary of the Christian Council of Mozambique (CCM) and I (representing the ELCA) were asked to assist with the process of the election of the bishop, general secretary, assembly president and church council.

Rev. S. Matsimbe (Dean of the Southern District) was elected to succeed Bishop Sinalo whose term had ended. The consecration of the bishop-elect and installation of the new officers is set to take place later in May.

The ELCA and other partners continue to seek ways to accompany the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Mozambique through mission outreach and support for diakonia and disaster response projects.

Thank you for your prayers, support and participation in God's Mission locally and globally.



1974: A substantial financial gift of \$66,261.00 was received from the Hilma Simonson estate on Feb 6th. Of this amount, \$26,433.00 was used to pay off the mortgage on the church. The remaining amount of \$39, 828.00 was used to create an Investment/Endowment Fund. Throughout the years, the interest earned has supported many causes with the church and our missions.

1981: Pastor Buendorf arrived on April 1st.

1982: A 70-member commission was appointed by the LCA, ALC and AELC to begin working out the details for a new national Lutheran church body.

1987: We are grateful for the many ways our members have helped to update and add to the necessary items of the church by memorializing their loved ones. New green paraments were purchased in memory of Evelyn Erickson, new blue paraments were purchased in memory of Harriet Norine and new white paraments were given in memory of Sidney Fredrickson.

1988: The new Evangelical Lutheran Church in America officially came into being. Dr. Herbert Chilstrom, son of this congregation, was elected as the first presiding Bishop (reelected to a 2nd term in 1991). On January 3, a Celebrative Service of Praise with Dr Richard Jensen as our speaker was held at the Litchfield High School gymnasium. We had to become used to new names, new faces, new places, new ways of thing, new titles and new orientations.

1988: A three-octave set of hand bells were purchased in memory of Louis and Clara Ekbom.

1990: The sanctuary was air conditioned.

1992: This was the beginning year of the First Stringers Music Group under the leadership of Marge Hellzen.

1994: First Lutheran became computerized.

1995: Matthew Goodrich, son of the congregation, was ordained during the morning worship service on July 30th. He is presently serving in his first call at Trinity Lutheran Church in Endicott Washington.

1997: Pastor Dan and Sandy Buendorf participated in a Lutheran World Relief study tour in India. They visited slum areas, drought-stricken areas, earthquake areas, villages, healthcare centers, mother Theresa's House of the Destitute, Home of the Dying and Orphanages. They presented their work to many communities, congregations and service clubs.

150th Anniversary

I am going to try my best to relate some of the events and stories of the 1950's

My father was pastor at First Lutheran from 1950-1961/1962?

I remember the old church and the large heating grate in the front of the church. John Erickson and I were acolytes when Sunday when he began to weave forth and back on his feet. He subsequently fainted on the floor and was taken back into the area behind the altar for help. Boy was I scared.

I remember the old organ in the old church which had a pump to put air into the bellows. The organ was in the balcony and played by Mrs. Leroy Gaynor.

I was in my father's first confirmation class. He combined two classes together so there were about 25-30 kids in the class. My father had us learn 60 Bible verses and we were to put them on recipe cards. One side had the verse written out and the other side had the location in the Bible where it was found. I still can remember many of the verses by heart. We were given a quiz in front of the congregation which was really very scary.

I remember the Sunday we march down Sibley Ave to the new church building from the old building. We were all very proud that day.

My father J. Henry Bergren was a "builder." The first building he had built was the new parsonage at 724 S. Ramsey. It was great to live in and make our home there. My father's office was near the front door so that people could come and visit him without disturbing the rest of the family. My brother, James, and I had our room near the door that went over the breezeway. In the winter, we would jump off the garage that was attached to the breezeway into snow banks. Later on he would serenade the neighborhood with great trumpet music.

The next building that my father was influential in getting built was the new church building. You still worship there even after all these years. It some ways it was ahead of its time. A free standing altar! Each Sunday the adult choir would march up to the front of the nave and back to the balcony for the worship service. The choir was directed by Mrs Lowell Wilson. Our Sunday School was led by Mildred Oslund and we also had a great Junior Mission Band as well as yearly Vacation Bible School.

The next building my Dad was instrumental in starting was the Emmaus Home. I understand that it has many buildings now. My Dad experienced a great deal of opposition from neighboring pastors, from neighboring towns, but he prevailed.

One humorous event was when my father was in a local men's clothing store, he said to one of the members, that he liked red ties. Every Christmas after that he got a red tie from this fellow.

The last memory I would like to share is that the last meeting of the Minnesota Synod of the Augustana Lutheran Church was held in the First Lutheran's new building. Dr. Franklin Clark Fry of the United Lutheran Church was there along with many of the officers of the synod. In our living room sat Dr. Fry, Dr. Edgar Carlson of Gustavus, Dr. Bertil Larson, my Greek teacher, some students from GAC and along with my father and several lay delegates from the Twin Cities. What a cross section of the church!

My father was the ordination sponsor of Dr. Herbert Chilstrom. My father was mentioned in Chilstrom's book, A Journey of Grace, several times. He also sponsored Pastor Eugene Strinden and his son, John, me.

I hope these thoughts will help you in your timeline story.
