October 2023 Time with Tom

October, a month that has drawn my attention for most of my life. I would look forward to October more than March, my birth month, because of the activities of October and the joy it brought me. October for me was what I worked so hard all year to reach. For a major part of my life, I spent a lot of time and effort preparing, training and planning for October. I was at one time, a serious pheasant hunter. Training dogs, practicing my shooting skills on the trap range and reading everything I could, to set my dogs up for a successful season. For a few years, a dog collar producer procured me to field-test their training collars and equipment, because I wore out every collar I purchased and they could not understand how someone could, as a hobby hunter, do that. I found myself so enveloped in the sport because of my love for the GSP (German Shorthaired Pointers) hunting dogs and the passion they had for the hunt that it consumed me. Jesus had some passionate disciples that gave everything to the work of the Gospel. Many died because of their ministry to the people and the struggles they dealt with in mission. Jesus calls us to follow him and we can look forward to the coming of the kingdom of Heaven or the kingdom of God with great enthusiasm knowing Jesus walks with us along the way. Jesus must look at us with a similar passion, full of hopefulness and joy as I did October and the pheasant-hunting season. The biggest difference is my love for hunting could not return the kind of love God has for me and the joy God receives when I share the good news with others. Let it be done for you as you wish." And her daughter was healed instantly) she shows her faith in an extraordinary way. Can we, with equally humble enthusiasm, call upon Jesus in faith, to bring the kingdom of God to us and to those around us so we too can look forward to the coming kingdom of heaven? We may not be worthy or deserving but what joy we can share, as we look for the coming Spirit of God and God's heavenly kingdom, Amen.
