### August 2024 Time with Tom

As you receive this newsletter, I may be in Portugal preparing to return home after serving the refugees and some immigrants with the housing needs of Braga. I write this as I prepare to depart, so I pray all things go well as you grow to know and love Pastor Michael in my absence. I trust my time with our students and the refugees we work with, has gone well. As I think about how the lives of others affect us and we them, scripture comes to mind of Jesus caring for all people. Teaching us how to love not only the ones that love us but all people including our enemy. Do not misunderstand me to say working with others, like refugees is calling them our enemy, but that they are people we may not know much about. Getting to know people from other cultures is exciting to me, and I should have stories to tell. Jesus wants us to look at others with a heart like Jesus' so we can truly see the person. Jesus talks about how when we care for the least of these we are caring for him. "Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; <sup>35</sup> for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me," and you will say when did I do that? "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are

members of my family, you did it to me." Jesus would later say; "Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' <sup>46</sup>And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life". Caring for others just because they have a need is what Jesus is talking about here. We are also in need and may learn from those we presume to serve. I hope that we can learn how to be compassionate and trusting. Maybe we will learn how to serve others in ways we have never experienced in our own lives. If we can see how others live in this world, maybe our eyes will be open to new ways to love one another. I long for a world that lives by caring for one another by lifting each other up, by putting others first. If we can learn from Luther, who reminds us to lift up our heads, stop being navel-gazers and look at others first. We may then find eyes like Jesus, that look for the love in others and not at the things that separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ. Let us share in the service to all people by giving of ourselves in ways that lift up and love our neighbors the way we would want to be loved. Amen. Live in peace and the God of Love and peace will be with you. 2<sup>nd</sup> Cor. 13:11 Pastor Tom Evenson
