September 2024 Moment with Michael

Then Jesus told them a parable about their need to *pray always* and not to lose heart. (Luke 18:1)

We often think of God as knowing it all: the past, the present, and the future. And this God knows us as we were, are, and who we will become. And moreover, what God wills, God can do, here and for all eternity. However, if this is the case, all is known and everything is already determined, I must ask, what sense does it make to ask anything of God in prayer?

Often, I've heard it argued, that God likes to be asked or that asking is good for our spiritual health. However, both of these answers just don't do it for me. If everything is already planned out than asking God for anything feels inauthentic and frankly, a waste of time. What if everything isn't planned, does this somehow diminish God or make belief in God irrelevant? What alternative is available where prayer could both be for our sake *and* be for God's sake?

Imagine with me that God is *not* totally independent from the world (which is the case for an all-knowing God), and rather, is deeply invested, involved, and intertwined with us and creation. Hopefully, this isn't all that much of a stretch when considering how the Bible is a collection of stories which speak of God hovering over the waters, wooing a nomad named Abram to live differently, leading a people out of Egypt to a promised land, walking amongst us in and through Jesus, guiding the emerging church by and with the presence of the Holy Spirit, all culminating to a renewal of all creation in a not-so-far-off future.

What would it mean for us, and our prayers, if rather than everything being predetermined and God knowing it all, what would it mean if God was interdependent with us and all of creation? If this were true, then just as surely, we receive from God, God would receive from us. This would mean that God gives to the world and receives from the world; and likewise, the world receives from God and gives to God.

We are told in our faith tradition that God bids us to pray, invites us to pray, inspires us to pray: and pray always. If we are truly in an interdependent relationship with God and all of creation, then God's call to us to pray is neither whimsical nor irrelevant. Rather, it's an invitation for us to join in the creative act of bringing a new creation into being, which I think sounds beautiful and awesome!

And so, with this in mind, please pray for our students and teachers as they begin a new academic year. Please pray for politicians as they seek to gain power and support. Please pray for our elderly as they transition from a season of warmth to cold. Please pray for our congregation as we continue to do the work of ministry in and around Litchfield. Please pray for your neighbor, your loved ones, and your enemies. Please pray, and pray always.

These were the daily themes that united 16,000 youth, young adults, and ministry leaders for the ELCA Youth Gathering July 16 -20 in New Orleans, LA. There has not been an ELCA Youth Gathering since 2018 - which means that more than a whole "high school generation" has not been able to attend a Gathering. Now - they have! And they are excited disciples of Jesus.

These events can be transformational! I wonder how many of you reading this story right now attended a Youth Gathering? (Raise your hands! ③)

I remember the first Youth Gathering I attended as a junior in high school. The impact of our pastor spending days riding on a school bus with us would never be forgotten. The power of being together with thousands and thousands of other Lutheran youth was not something I ever could have imagined: it was amazing! The faith created in my heart through the music, the talks, and the worships changed my life. I didn't realize it at the time, but the growth of ministry began to take root in my life because of that Gathering.

The Southwestern Minnesota Synod sent over 380 students and 120 adult leaders to participate in this Gathering. Thanks go out to Pr. Jon Wendt who served as our Synod Champion, taking point and providing coordination and guidance for all of our people. Thank you, Pr. Jon!

I am so proud of our Synod Youth Band for providing the music and worship leadership for "Minnesota Day". This worship service was attended by 2,600 participants from ALL of the 6 Minnesota synods. Under the direction of Pr. Hans Peterson, the band had been practicing and preparing for 6 months. Their musical skills and faith in Christ shined brightly.
