The Easter season is among us, and the Easter story needs to be told. What does Easter mean to you? Can you recall an Easter that stands out to you as life changing or maybe something you think is important or something that stands out in your memory that was good? Easter stories can be hard enough to come up with and then I put requirements on them. Telling the story of our life's events may be difficult enough without attaching them to the most important event in Christian history. We may have lots of stories we tell, mostly to our family and friends but what about telling your story to someone who you do not know. What makes a story worth telling everyone, even to people you do not know. As disciples of Jesus Christ we are sent into the world, more accurately, to the ends of the earth, to tell a story, the Good News of Jesus Christ. The Easter story is the Good News story. February 2026 Financial

Income: \$34,342.41

Expenses: \$79,288.00

February's financial spend was elevated with the inclusion of 3 one-time expenses, all approved during the annual meeting budget vote. First Lutheran switched phone and internet carrier from Nuvera to Vibrant, which required hardware upgrades and installation services, accounting for \$6073. Consulting services to advise on accounting best practices as we transitioned to fiscal year reporting totaled \$650. Additionally, as approved during the annual meeting, First Lutheran sent funds totally \$30,000 to the Synod to support their building remodel project. Monies for the Synod support were funded with \$15,000 drawn from our dedicated Thrivent Dollars and \$15,000 from our general fund account. Thank you for your continued financial support.

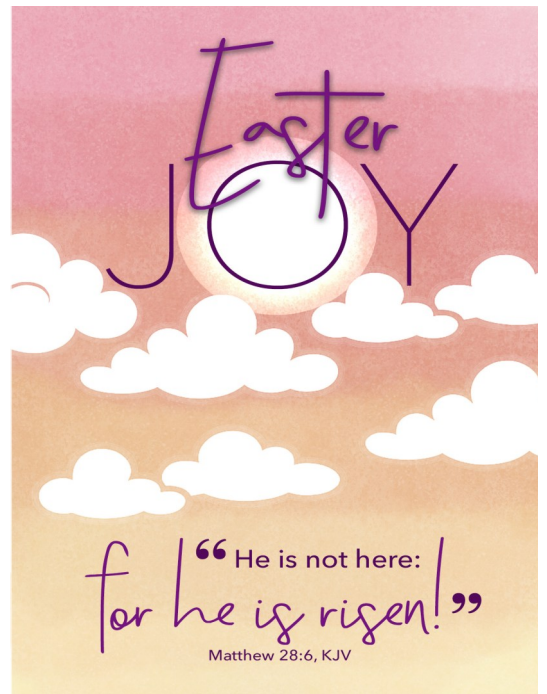

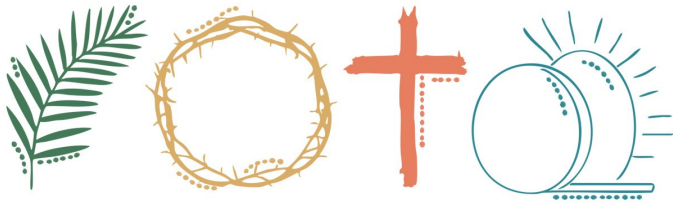

WELCA MINUTES MARCH 19, 2026

WELCA met on March 19, 2026, in the Chapel with Betty Allen calling the meeting to order. The Purpose Statement was recited. Devotions were given by Betty.

Our meeting was paused for our speaker. Jenny Klima, Executive Director of the Housing & Redevelopment Authority of Litchfield spoke on the proposed new "Lincoln Apt." development. This would be a Multifamily Housing Project that will ensure that families, seniors, and individuals who live and work in our community can continue to do so without being burdened by rising housing and other cost of living costs.

Land has been purchased North of Meeker Manor on the empty lot for the proposed development. The HRA has partnered with a co-developer to help navigate through the process. An application will be submitted to the MN Housing Authority for funding in July. They want to include as complete a report as possible. They even have a Letter of Support for the project that can be signed. Copies are available to the office to sign and show your support. They will all be attached to the application. Approximately 30 apartments would be in the complex with 3½ stories with parking underground. Plans are subject to change, but one to three-bedroom apartments would be built with a possibility of a four-bedroom apartment. Affordable rental housing-serving households up to 60% AMI (Average Median Income.)

Amenities considered could include a dog run, playground, gardens, a community room, laundry room and three offices and possibility of storage areas. The application decision will be made public in December. If it's approved, it will be possible to break ground in the Spring and maybe fill by Winter.

Meeting Continued: Karla Kadelbach made a motion with a second by Karen Eberhard to approve the secretary's report from February as printed.

Lana Johnson made a motion with a second by Karla Kadelbach to accept the treasurer's report as printed.

Old Business: WELCA's soup supper was held March 18th and was well attended and thanks you to everyone who made soup, sandwiches, bars and worked.

Betty had given the okay to Karla Hyberger to order four new double boilers which were desperately needed to make it easier for all groups to make soup for the soup suppers. The old ones didn't fit together and were so dented that made them impossible to use. The total cost was \$375. If WELCA didn't want to pay for them, Betty would. Karla Kadelbach made a motion that WELCA pay the \$ 375 and Sue Lemmer made the second. Motion carried for WELCA to pay for the double boilers.

New Business: The broken dishwasher!!!! A new switch was installed and that didn't fix the problem. Now it needs a mother board, expensive, but no guarantee it will work. Do we continue to hope that a fix will be found or do we go ahead and buy a new dishwasher. The current dishwasher was in the basement kitchen and was brought upstairs when the new Chilstrom Hall was constructed. (that has been 32 years)
An offer was made to pay for half the cost of a new dishwasher which could cost anywhere between \$8,000 up to \$19,000. Does the cost fall to the Property Team, WELCA or from special funds?? No final decision has been made.

The faucet in the kitchen needs to be replaced. A leak under the sink was discovered at the last funeral. Virgil Rick came that morning and replaced the sprayer, but a new faucet is recommended. A motion was made by Sue Lemmer to replace the faucet with a second by Kris Nelson. Motion carried to replace the faucet. Betty will talk to Virgil about changing it.

Serving Soup Suppers: It's a church thing. All organizations pull together and have for years. Traditionally the serving has gone to Christian Ed, Men's Group, Music, (alternating between Praise Worship and Choir), WELCA and Church Council. There are several families that possibly could serve 3 times, 4 times, or even 5 times. What is fair? Some church members don't donate food or work at any of the suppers.

Do we sign up as a whole church and if no one signs up for a week, there won't be a supper?

Do we continue with the same 5 groups?

Do we pass a sheet for others to sign-up and offer to donate or work?

Do we stop serving Lenten Soup Suppers?

Do individuals decide which one of the many groups you choose to work with and say no to the others?

Do they bring food to one group and offer to work with another group?

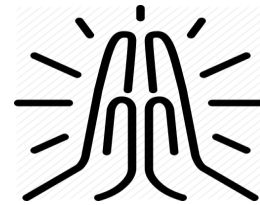

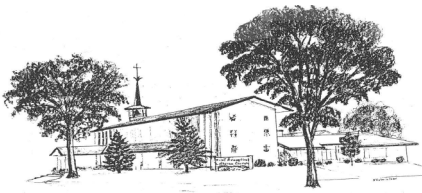
